Dear First Lutheran faith family,

Happy September! We have entered an exciting time in the life of our congregation, with Wednesday School and Confirmation starting up again. Our children and youth are not the "future of the church," as we so often think – they are the church now! And, just as much as we adults help shape their budding faith, so too do they shape us, and shape us for the better. So, in this article, you'll find some basic details for the things coming up in September, as well as what this month means as a season in the church year.

Wednesday School will begin September 27th at 6:00 pm. Each week will be 6-7 pm, and we'll have lots of music, Bible stories, and crafts each week. I'm looking forward to bringing in my guitar and growing with our young ones as they grow in their faith as little Lutherans.

Confirmation will be done a little differently this year. We are splitting out the 9th graders from the 7th and 8th grades. I have done this model of Confirmation most of my time as a pastor, and it works really well. It gives me a more focused time on those who will be affirming their baptism (being confirmed) next spring, and also gives space for the wide variety of ages (and energy levels) that exist within 7-9 grade. Confirmation for 7th-8th grade students begins on September 20th, at 6:30 pm, and will meet each month on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays. 9th grade Confirmation begins on September 27th, also at 6:30 pm, and will meet each month on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays.

Season of Creation

September 1 – October 4 marks an unofficial season in the church year – the Season of Creation. Genesis 1:31 reminds us: "God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good" and 2:15 also, "The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and guard it." Although there's a lot of busy-ness in our personal lives right now, we also pause to give thanks for God's gift of creation, which is not something to be used up by us humans, but it is something to cherish and take care of not just for ourselves but for the generations to come.

From the Season of Creation website, www.seasonofcreation.org: "The Season of Creation is a time to renew our relationship with our Creator and all creation through celebration, conversion, and commitment together. During the Season of Creation, we join our sisters and brothers in the ecumenical family in prayer and action for our common home."

Personal Care Kits

Cleanliness may not actually be next to godliness, but it certainly helps a person feel more human. When families find their homes destroyed, or must flee for their safety, soap and a towel rarely make the cut for what they can carry. Arriving in a refugee camp or other place of safety, they are scared, vulnerable and dirty from the travel. The simple items included in a Personal Care Kit provide muchneeded self-care, critical germ fighting, and the chance to regain dignity amidst situations of fear and uncertainty.

Please review the General Assembly instructions on page 1 before collecting items for Personal Care Kits.

Include the following items in each Personal Care Kit:

- One light-weight bath-size towel (20" X 40" to 52" X 27"), dark color recommended
- Two or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz, any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars
- One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging*
- One sturdy comb. There are many different types of hair texture, so no picks or fine-toothed combs; remove packaging
- One metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging
- *Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap.

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.

All items should be new and in good condition. Wrap all the items in the towel and secure with ribbon, yarn, or rubber bands. Do not enclose the kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

Shipping Note: LWR's approximate cost to handle and ship one Personal Care Kit overseas is \$2.65 (including the addition of a tube of toothpaste). See Page 15 to learn how to support the LWR Quilt & Kit Shipping Fund.

WANT TO GET THE MOST BANG FOR YOUR BUCK? Buy in Bulk!

Purchasing kit items in bulk saves time and money. Here are some tips to get started:

ONLINE: Many websites, such as overstock.com, carry items appropriate for LWR kits and often have sales. Inspect items carefully to make sure they meet LWR guidelines and are of good quality.

CLUB STORES: Does anyone in your congregation have a membership to Costco, Sam's Club or BJ's? You can get bulk prices for kit items from these stores.

ASK: Some local stores may be willing to place a bulk order for you and even cut you a discount if they know that you'll be using the supplies to help people in need. It never hurts to ask!


