ANNUAL CHRISTMAS FOOD BASKET/SHARING TREE PROJECT

Dear Community Members and Businesses:

With fall in the air, it is time to start planning the annual Christmas Food Basket and Sharing Tree Projects, here at Marshall County Social Services. As we have in past years, we plan to distribute Christmas Food Baskets to elderly and disabled individuals in Marshall County; the Sharing Tree Project will be distributing toys, quilts, and gloves to children in our county who are in need. For years, these projects have been possible, because of generous donations from local businesses and community members. We hope to continue with these projects, helping to spread some Christmas joy.

Once again, we are asking for monetary donations to help support these projects. Donations are used for the purchase of food and other grocery items to make up the food baskets and to buy gloves, toys, and other gift items to use towards the Sharing Tree Project.

Along with monetary donations towards these projects, we also appreciate donations of new items of toys and winter gloves. We are also incredibly grateful for any donations of handmade quilts. All donated quilts are given to families who have indicated a need for this. All these items are used for gifts for the children on the Sharing Tree list, last year 226 children received gifts.

Community contributions received last year made it possible to distribute 136 food baskets. The food items for the food baskets are purchased locally and once the baskets are made up, they will be delivered to the needy and elderly by staff and volunteers.

President Connie called the meeting to order.

Betsy gave devotions.

Secretary's report: Minutes were updated with Kris Ann's attendance and addition of Whitney being the person who found the pressure washing service. Motion by Betsy to accept the August minutes with changes, seconded by Brian. All in favor, motion carried.

Treasurer's report: Darlene presented August's offerings. Melanie made a motion to accept the minutes. Whitney seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

Trustees:

• Seamless Pro gave us a quote to do the gutters. The total cost for the gutter replacement is \$9016.00. They will get it done before winter if we send them ½ as their down payment. Kris Ann made a motion to move forward, seconded by Jess.

Parish Education:

- Wednesday School will start September 27th and run from 6:00-7:00.
- Confirmation for 7th & 8th graders will start on September 20th from 6:30-7:30.
- Confirmation for 9th graders will begin on September 27th from 6:30-7:30.
- October 8th we will give 2nd & 3rd graders the story Bibles, have a backpack blessing, and this will be the 1st time
 the Wednesday School classes will sing in church.

Stewardship:

- The church sign that people have been donating money towards is still in the works. We have \$6,024.70 in donations so far. When Betsy gets the quote, she will send it out to the council right away.
- The toddler musical flowers for Harmony Park are in. Betsy will contact someone to pour the cement. This way they
 can be installed before winter. We already have taken in donations for the instillation. Kris Ann made a motion that if
 the installation is more than \$500, she can go ahead. This was seconded by Pat.
- September 24th is the Harvest Festival from 4:30-6:30. A sign-up sheet will be put out. Council will stay after church on the 24th to get things organized.

Pastor's Report:

October 1st would like to have a pet blessing. It wouldn't be during church, but Brother Jeff would like to offer something from 11:00-11:30.

- Currently we are putting together 3 bulletins every week. They would like to streamline this and just print 1 bulletin that would work for everyone.
- Last month we talked about developing the mission statement. Brother Jeff has a form that he'd like the council to look at in the next month. At next month's meeting we will talk about what our thoughts are about the form, and then we will move forward with having congregation members fill out the form.
