### Dear First Lutheran faith family,

Happy November! Fall is withdrawing quickly and the long winter is fast approaching. Thankfully, we have God's constant presence with us through the Holy Spirit to warm our hearts as we prepare!

We have a couple special services to make note of in November:

### November 5th: All Saints Sunday

All Saints Sunday is a Christian celebration going back to at least the 4th century. On this Sunday, we'll remember those in our congregation who have passed in the last year, and remember Jesus promise to us: "Because I live, you will live also" (John 14:19).

Fun fact: it was originally named "All Hallows Day" in English, which means the day before was "All Hallows Eve," or as we know it today, Halloween! Halloween was, and always has been, a tradition of making light of death's hold on us. And after having a little good fun, the promise of resurrection and eternal life is then celebrated either on November 1 or the first Sunday after Halloween.

### · November 26th: Thanksgiving Sunday

Because of a much-needed vacation for me, we will not have an ecumenical Thanksgiving service leading up to Thanksgiving Day. However, we will have a special "Thanksgiving Sunday" for our congregation on the 26th, which is the Sunday after Thanksgiving. I hope you'll join us, either in-person or online!

### A quick word about Thanksgiving -

For us as Christians, thanksgiving is a way of life. Everything we have – life, health, clothing, food, shelter, family, friends, work, hobbies – is a gift from God, which we should be thankful for every day. Martin Luther writes in his explanation of the Creed that God gives us all this "out of a pure, parental, and divine goodness and mercy." Our response, as Christians, is "to thank and praise, serve and obey God," Luther says. So, be thankful! God has, and continues to, give you all good things.

As we give thanks this month, may God bless us with peace and everything good!

### ANNUAL CHRISTMAS FOOD BASKET/SHARING TREE PROJECT

Dear Community Members and Businesses:

With fall in the air, it is time to start planning the annual Christmas Food Basket and Sharing Tree Projects, here at Marshall County Social Services. As we have in past years, we plan to distribute Christmas Food Baskets to elderly and disabled individuals in Marshall County; the Sharing Tree Project will be distributing toys, quilts, and gloves to children in our county who are in need. For years, these projects have been possible, because of generous donations from local businesses and community members. We hope to continue with these projects, helping to spread some Christmas joy.

Once again, we are asking for monetary donations to help support these projects. Donations are used for the purchase of food and other grocery items to make up the food baskets and to buy gloves, toys, and other gift items to use towards the Sharing Tree Project.

Along with monetary donations towards these projects, we also appreciate donations of new items of toys and winter gloves. We are also incredibly grateful for any donations of handmade quilts. All donated quilts are given to families who have indicated a need for this. All these items are used for gifts for the children on the Sharing Tree list, last year 226 children received gifts.

Community contributions received last year made it possible to distribute 136 food baskets. The food items for the food baskets are purchased locally and once the baskets are made up, they will be delivered to the needy and elderly by staff and volunteers.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**


- Sanctuary lighting is quite dim compared to the fellowship hall. We will look into options to improve the lighting in there.
